Director Green: Thank you. Good evening Council. Most of my agenda is in order. However, I would like to provide a short update on our Covid-19 response. The Health Department has responded over 2,274 reports of positive Covid-19 cases today. Each response includes interviews, parenting guidance, support contact information and followed by the Nursing Division and Health Department staff both working hard and long hours. In addition we had also placed an ad in contacts and raise awareness on the news Statewide Health care system effective June 3rd and we believe that this message to the community will reduce the potential for this disease transmission. Additionally I am happy to report that the number of the cases have declined recently and I encourage everyone to remain conscious, practice social distancing where they are coming publicly so we keep these numbers low. I also want to report that our Health Division has been working long and hard on responding over Covid-19. The inspectors have countless calls on Covid-19 and responded to over 150 complaints concerning local business compliance with Covid-19 across. Additionally, they have either made contact with a personal visit at numerous local restaurants, childcare centers, personal care salons, summer camps and public swimming pools to provide guidance and information on many executive orders that state has issued over the past several months. As more establishments reopen, we will continue to be there and provide guidance and assistance. I want to emphasize that nursing response and Environmental response will be an ongoing operation requiring several manpower for the unforeseeable future. I also want to take this opportunity to thank Council and the Administration as well as all other staff and departments for all their support over the past several months. A lot especially thankful to a certain extent to the Health Department for their tremendous effort of time dedicated to responding to this pandemic and then each and every one have the extra efforts to respond and serve the community through this unusual time. They continue to make me proud to be part of this team and this community. Thank you. That's all I got.
